### You Are a Preacher

The term "preacher" often carries with it the idea of a man who works throughout the week, ministering to the congregation while also working on lessons for Sunday. Unfortunately, that's about as far as the term reaches for the modern mind. In actual fact, we are all preachers!

Preaching derives from the word kerysso which literally means "to proclaim, or make public declaration." Mark 1:45 is a good place to start when looking at this word. Most translations will say that this man, after encountering Jesus, went about "talking" or "proclaiming" freely. In fact, whether you realise it or not, you are preaching on a daily basis. You are constantly broadcasting some sort of message with the life you live.

Paul makes the implication that he does not preach himself, but Christ (2 Cor. 4:5). The question then must be asked, what is it that I preach in my life? Do I preach monetary gain? Do I preach myself? Do I proclaim and declare pessimism and grumbles? Or do I preach Christ and the joy, peace, hope, and faith He provides?

From a practicality standpoint, there are two ways to preach. An individual can devote his life solely to the life of ministry. There is also the option to preach Christ in your everyday life, whether at your job or in your school. This seemed to be the route that many in the Bible took. If you look at the occupations of the Bible, you'd be astounded at the normality of the lives that people lived. Here are some examples - Isaac was an expert bow-hunter; Peter, Andrew, James, and John were fishermen and Paul was a tentmaker. There was a gardener amidst the tomb where Jesus was laid.

No matter where we are in life, we are all preachers. But we must ask the question; what is it that we preach?

### Pakistan's Ongoing Injustice

Christians in Pakistan may number as many as 3.5 million, about 3% of the population, but they are despised and discriminated against by most of the Muslim majority.

As a result, many Christians live in poverty and are restricted to dangerous, dirty, low-status jobs such as cleaning sewers. Violent attacks, once rare, have increased in the last two decades.

Christians seldom get justice, because police usually discriminate against them. Even in the courts the testimony of Muslims will override that of others, in accordance with sharia.

Social injustice is so widespread that an estimated 700 Christian women and girls are kidnapped each year and forced to marry Muslims.
