******** Jesus, the Constant

★ Jesus has a way of remaining consistent even under the most chaotic of ★ circumstances. In the eighth chapter of Luke, we have a small, but mighty, account of the Lord calming a storm on the sea.


It is true that the disciples were in danger. Luke affirms the reality of danger in 8:23. However, before that, it is also true that Jesus told His disciples to travel to the other side of the lake. Unfortunately, the storm of fear was mightier than the calm of faith for these disciples.

There are several truths to be gleaned from such a brief account of Jesus with His disciples. Here are a few to consider:

- Jesus Leads to the Shore (Luke 8:22) The Lord gave the Destination but the disciples had a problem with the journey. Faith doesn't back down at the sight of danger.
- Danger is a Reality (Luke 8:23) This account does not try to downplay the reality of danger. However, faith can overcome surrounding variables.
- Jesus is a Constant in Times of Chaos (Luke 8:24) Notice the disposition of Jesus; He was sleeping in the storm. What felt like the end of the world to the disciples, was merely just brief experience for Jesus.

★ We may see the difficulties associated with the virus, but we may also see a beautiful blue sky and the mountains standing proud. While mankind may be frantic, nature harmonises with peace. It goes to show that there are constants even among chaos. Jesus can be that rock that → He describes in Matthew 7:25:

"and the rain fell. and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house, but it did not fall, because it had been founded on the rock."

Cares and Concerns

"Casting all your anxieties on Him, because He cares for you."

1 Peter 5:7 (ESV)

Our Scripture says in 1 Peter 5:7 we ought to cast our cares upon God. The word "cast" means to throw forcibly. As it's used in Scripture, it implies more than a casual placing of our concerns at Jesus' feet. Casting our cares upon God gives us a picture of forcibly tossing our cares and troubles as far away from us as they will go, trusting that the God who loves us can catch them and knows exactly how to deal with all that concerns us.

The Amplified Bible version of that same verse says, "casting all your cares [all your anxieties, all your worries, and all your concerns, once and for all] on Him, for He cares about you [with deepest affection, and watches over you very carefully]."

Cast or throw them with all of your might at the feet of Jesus. Pray with

faith, believing God does care and He is fully capable of handling your requests.
